Prayer Coordinator Responsibilities

NDP Prayer Coordinators serve as a 'watchmen' for their communities, states and nation.
Jeremiah 29:7, Ezekiel 3:16

Coordinate/Support a Single Prayer Gathering. The Prayer Coordinator position exists to coordinate and support a singularly-focused prayer gathering on the first Thursday in May at a church, business, government building, school, home or other appropriate location. Prayer Coordinators are encouraged to recruit a team of people to help organize and support the local event. Communicate and Seek Help as Needed. City, County or Area Coordinators (if these positions are filled, otherwise the state coordinator) provide oversight for the activities of the Prayer Coordinator and are the first line of support for this position. Prayer coordinators are expected to be in contact with the Area, County or City Coordinators who provide training, direction, guidance, encouragement, prayer support, and general assistance as needed.

Register The Prayer Gathering. The Prayer Coordinator is responsible for informing their State Coordinators about their scheduled prayer gathering by registering their event at the national NDP website (www.nationaldayofprayer.org). This provides a way to promote the local gathering because visitors to the website can search for prayer gatherings in their geographic area. It also allows the state and national NDP leadership to track and report on prayer coverage.

Submit a Post-event Summary Report. After the NDP prayer gathering has taken place, the Prayer Coordinator is responsible for preparing and submitting a summary report (an online survey) that highlights the number of attendees and anything noteworthy that took place during the prayer time.

Support Year Round Prayer. As the Lord leads, a Prayer Coordinator is encouraged to coordinate/support periodic prayer gatherings for their city or community. Many lead monthly or weekly prayer sessions that include multiple churches and ministries.
